

There are eight golf courses and two pitch and putt courses around the island, each of them striking in their own unique ways. They are designed by professional golfers, such as Donald Steel and Severiano Ballesteros, among others.

Amarilla Golf, in the South of the island, was designed by Donald Steel. The 18-hole fold course overlooks the sea and has a distinguishable 5th hole, where golfers are obliged to drive the ball over the waves onto the next green. Palm trees, cannas indicas flowers, Canary pine trees and obstacles liven up each hole, while offering fantastic views of Tenerife's jewel, Mt. Teide. The club has a pitch and putt course, a swimming pool and a horse-riding club, offering a heightened experience.

The 18-hole Buenavista Golf is designed by Severiano Ballesteros. Located on striking cliffs and flanked by the impressive Teno Country Park, this golf course in the north of Tenerife enjoys close proximity to the stunning coastline. Golfers will feel like they are hitting the ball straight into the ocean. In the first half, the most demanding holes are the par fours and in the second half the par threes require greater precision, particularly the 15th and the 17th holes, with both located on the cliff edge. This unusual course in north Tenerife, includes a large central lake in front of the Club House and a waterfall.

Other golf courses on the island include Abama Golf, Golf Costa Adeje (south), Golf del Sur, Golf las Américas, Real Club de Golf de Tenerife, Tecina Golf and Centro de Golf Los Palos.
